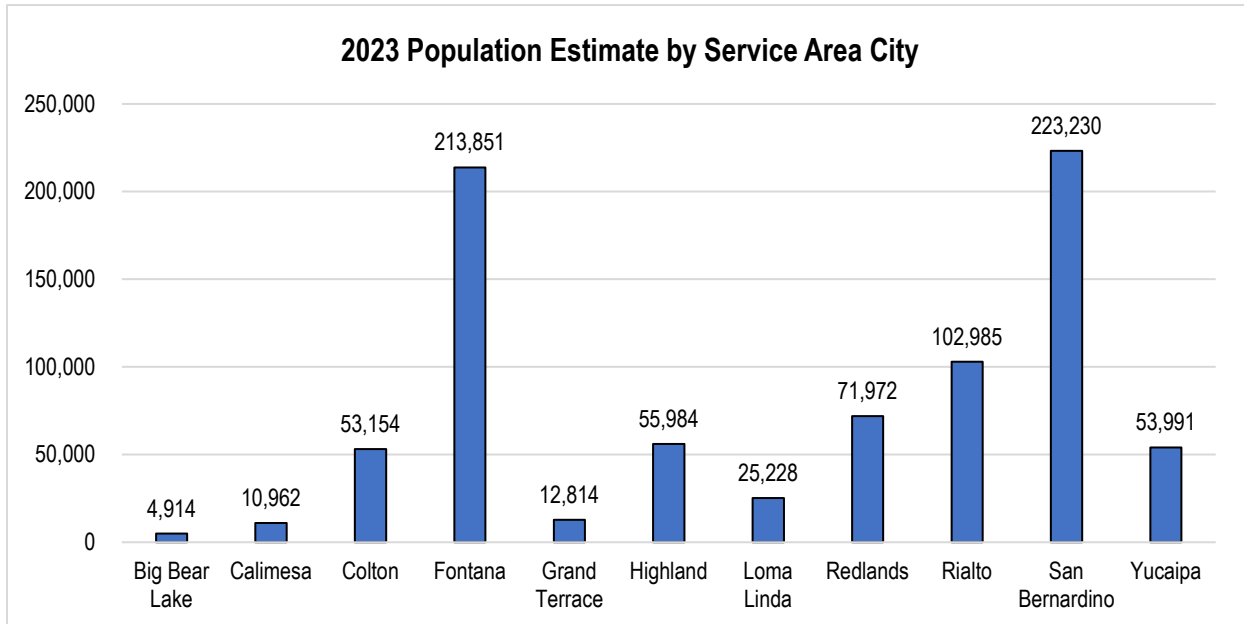

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General Population – Service Area Cities 2010-2023

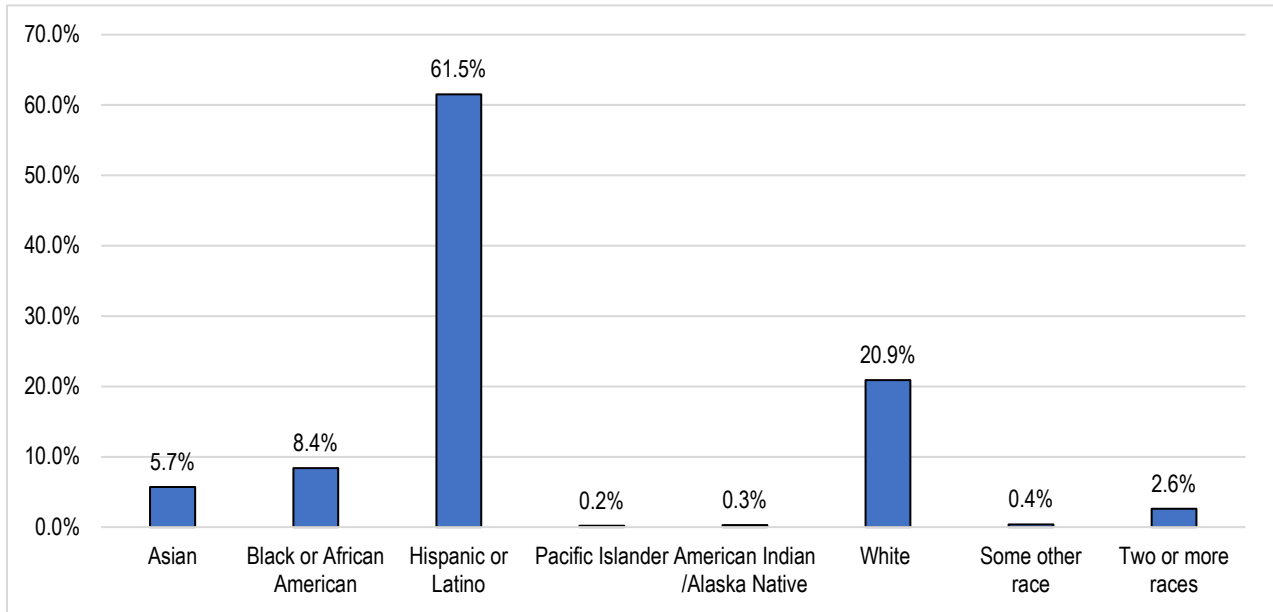

The San Bernardino Community College District service area represents 34.0% of the total San Bernardino County population. The top 3 cities – San Bernardino, Fontana, and Rialto represent about 65.1% of the service area population. The service area population increased by 0.1 percent to 615,234 between 2020 and 2023. Service area cities with the largest numeric growth were Fontana (+5,117), Calimesa (+934), and Loma Linda (+232). Fastest growing service area cities are Calimesa (9.3%), and Fontana (2.5%).

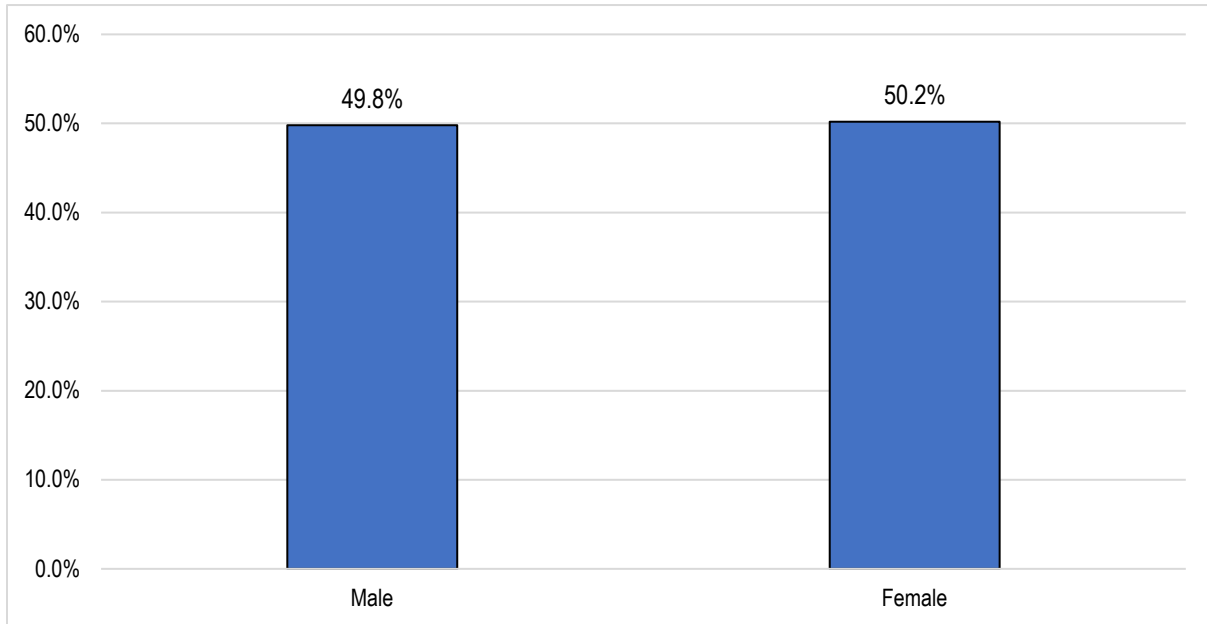

Ethnically, the population of the SBCCD service area cities is 61.5% Hispanic, 20.9% White, 8.4% African American, 5.7% Asian, 2.6% Two or More Race, 0.2% American Indians/Alaska Natives, 0.3% Pacific Islander, and 0.4% Some other race. In Rialto, Colton, Fontana, and San Bernardino, more than 67% of the residents are Hispanic. In Big Bear Lake, Calimesa, and Yucaipa, more than 55% of the residents are White. In Loma Linda, 25.3% of the residents are Asian.

Gender Distribution: 2022

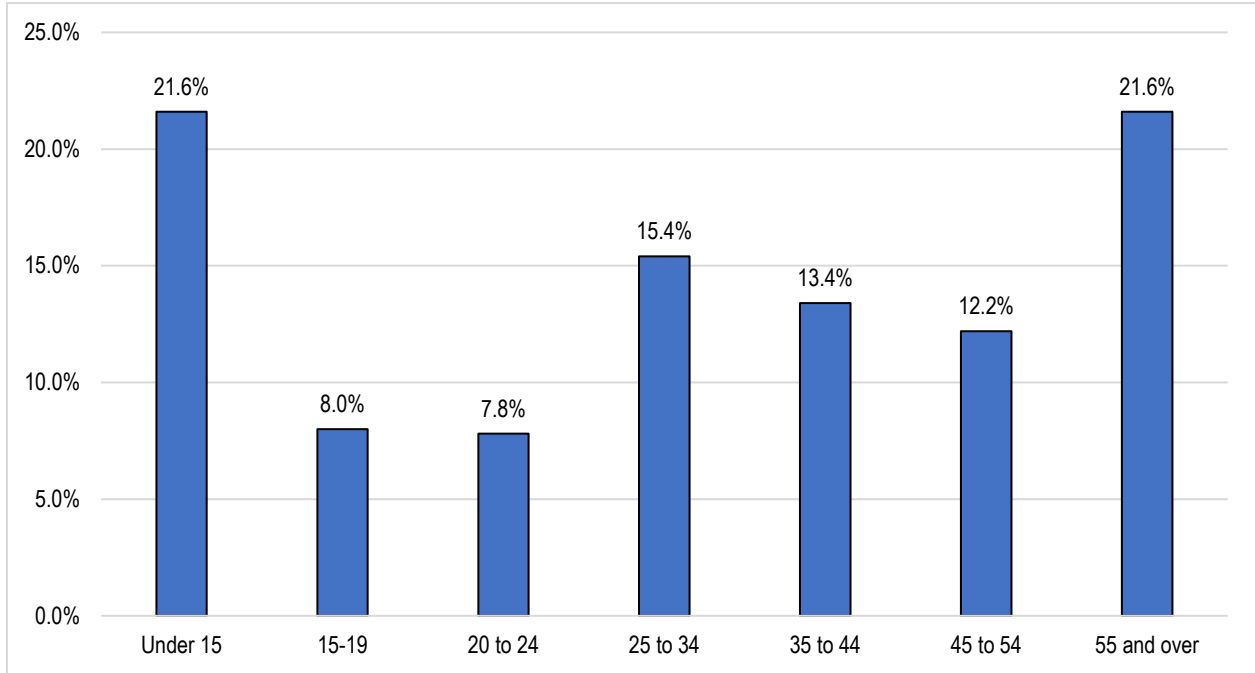

Age Range Distribution: 2022



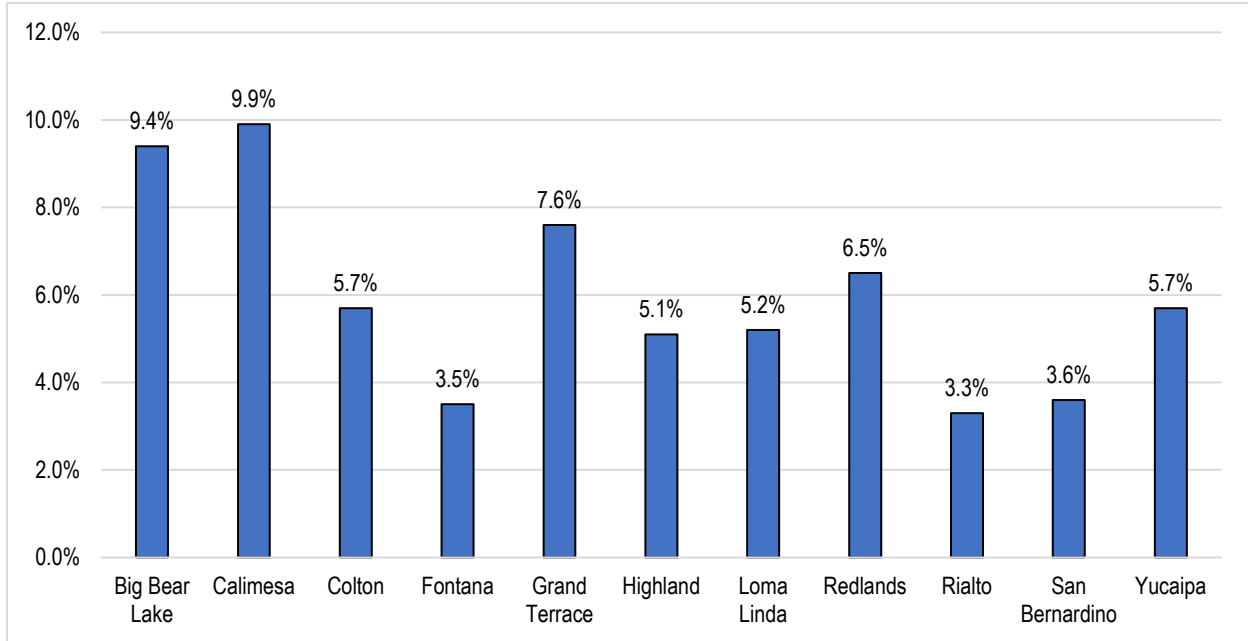

The two largest age groups in the SBCCD’s service Area cities are residents under 15 years of age (21.6%) and residents 55 years of age or older (21.6%). Together these ages groups make up nearly 43.2% of the service area population. The median age in the SBCCD service area population is 36.4 years old, which is older than the county’s median age.

The median age in Big Bear is the highest in the service area at 47.5 years. Calimesa’s median age of 44.0 years is the next highest. Riato and San Bernardino had the lowest median age (31.2 years).

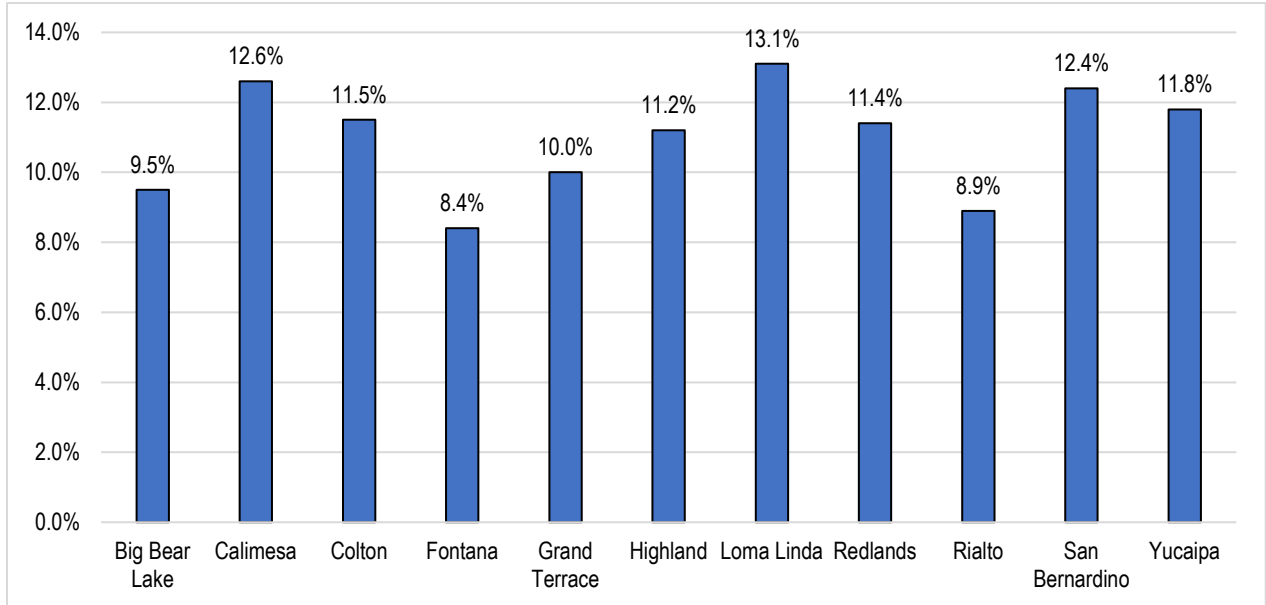

Among the civilian population 18 years and older, 4.4 percent of the service area population are veterans, which is lower than the state's percentage (4.7%). The service area city with the highest percentage of veterans is Calimesa (9.9%). Big Bear Lake (9.4%), Grand Terrace (8.4%), and Grand Terrace (7.6%) follow.

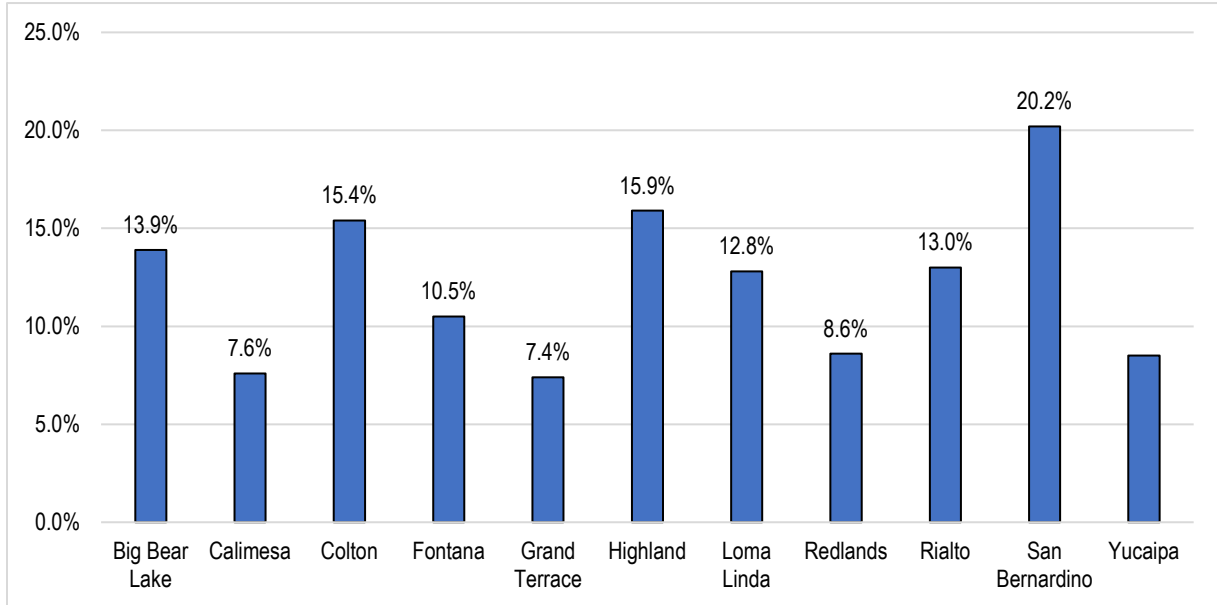

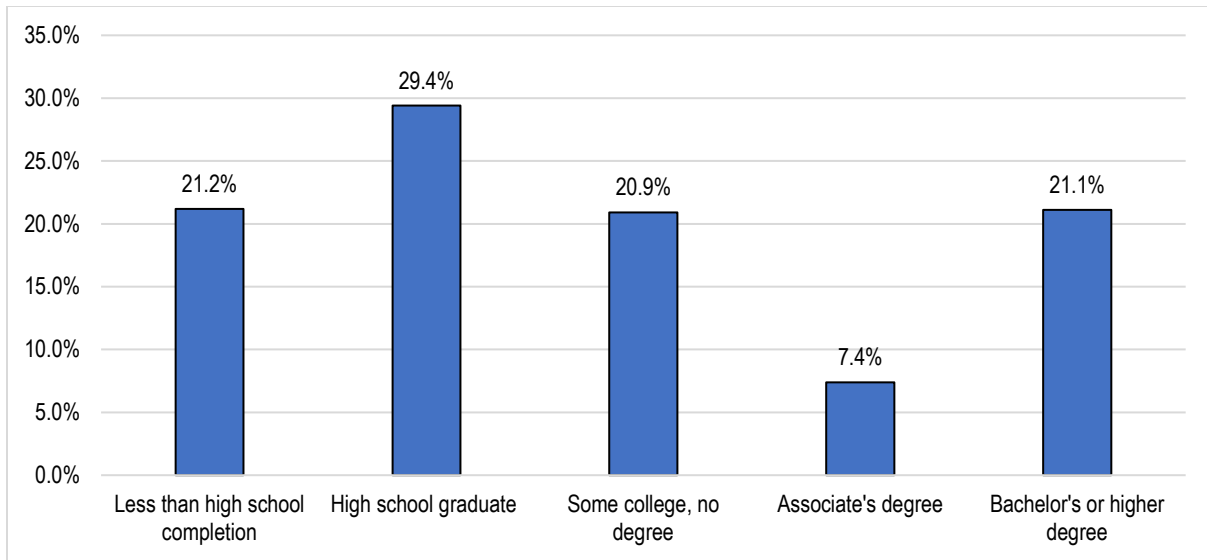

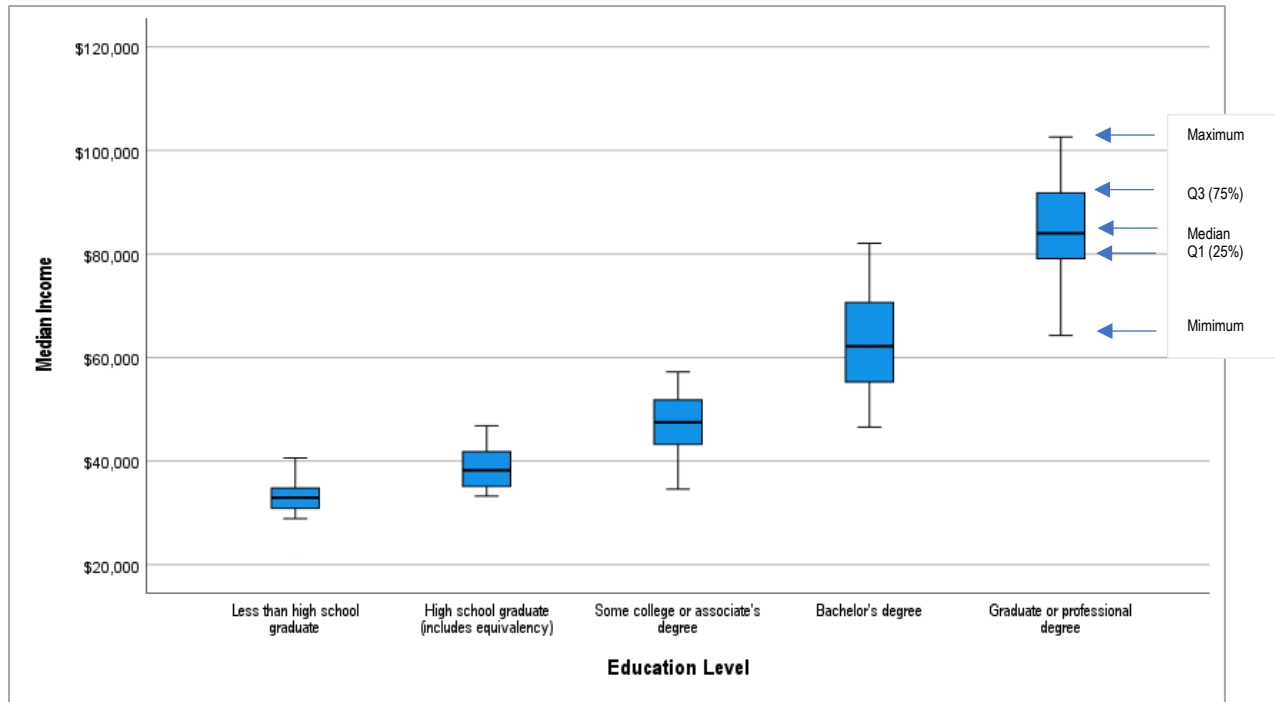

Among adults aged 25 and older, approximately fifty percent of the service area population have a high school diploma or lower, while 28.5 percent have a college degree (Associates degree or higher). Over 55 percent of the residents in San Bernardino (60.6%), Rialto (59.7%), and Colton (55.3%) have a high school diploma or have not completed High School. About 40% of the residents in Loma Linda (49.4%) and Redlands (43.4%) hold college degrees.

Median Annual Earnings by Educational Attainment, Population 25 Years and Over with Earnings

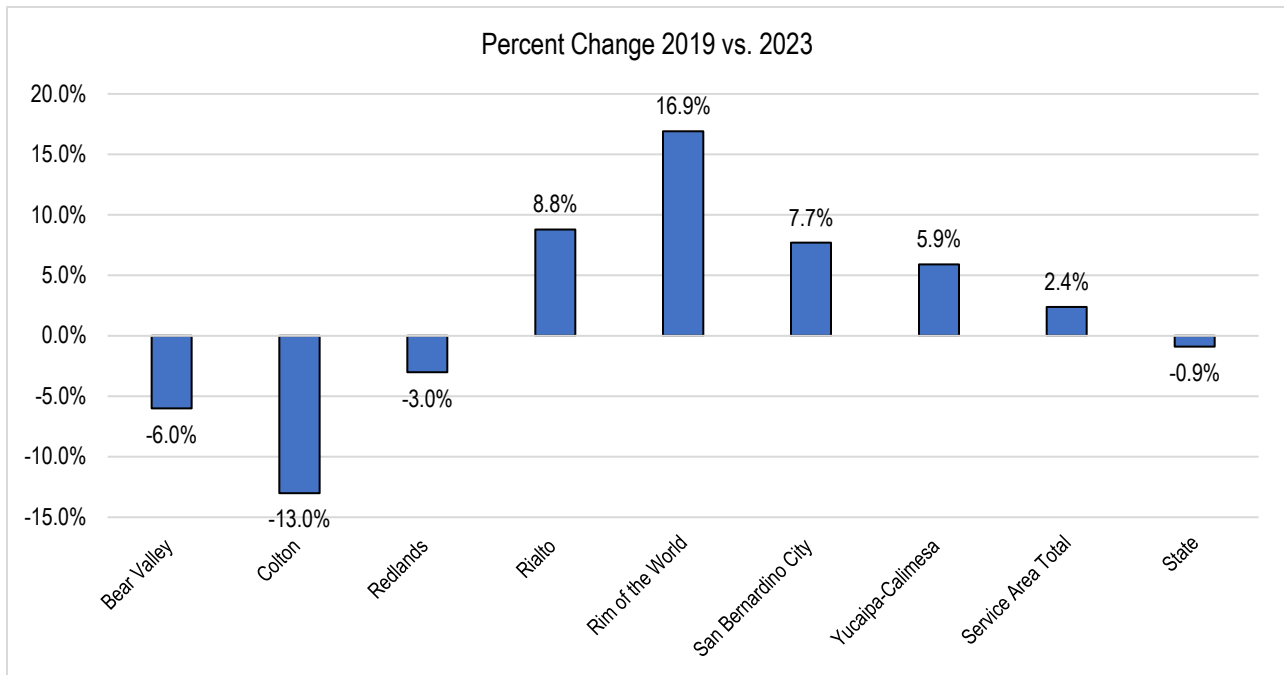

The box plots above show the summary of the minimum income, first quartile, median, third quartile, and maximum income for each education level. Educational attainment is strongly correlated with median incomes, per the Census Bureau's data. The median annual earning of the residents who hold a high school diploma or did not complete high school was lower than the residents who hold a college degree. The median annual earnings were different among the 11 service area cities. Redlands (\$56,730) and Calimesa (\$56,266) had the highest median earnings, while San Bernardino (\$36,530) had the lowest median earnings.

**Graduation Rate is the percentage of students who received a high school diploma within four or five years of entering ninth grade or completed their graduation requirements at an alternative school.

During the 2022-2023 Academic year, 9,690 students graduated from service area high schools. This was an increase of 227 students over the 2018-19-2022-23 academic year. Rim of the World Unified School District (+16.9%) had the largest increase in the number of graduates, followed by Rialto (+8.8%), San Bernardino City (+7.7%), and Yucaipa-Calimesa Unified School Districts (5.9%). However, Colton (-13.0%) and Bear Valley (-6.0%) had the largest decrease in the number of graduates.

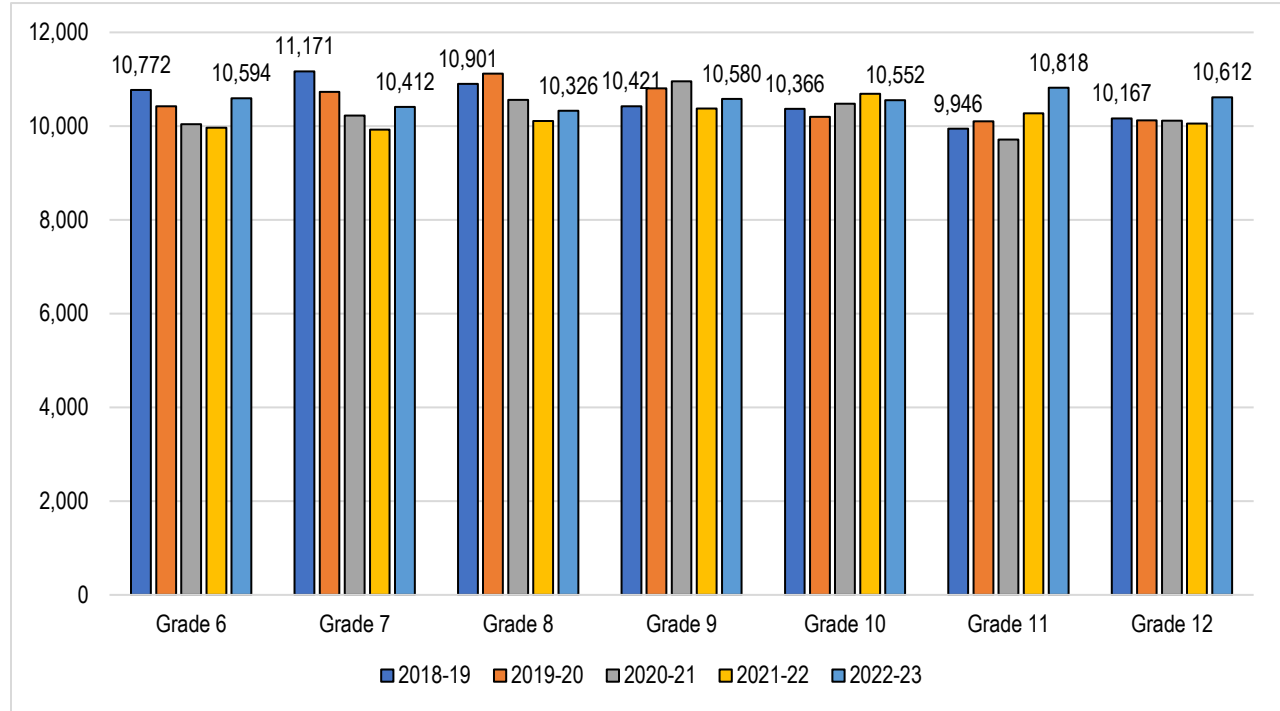

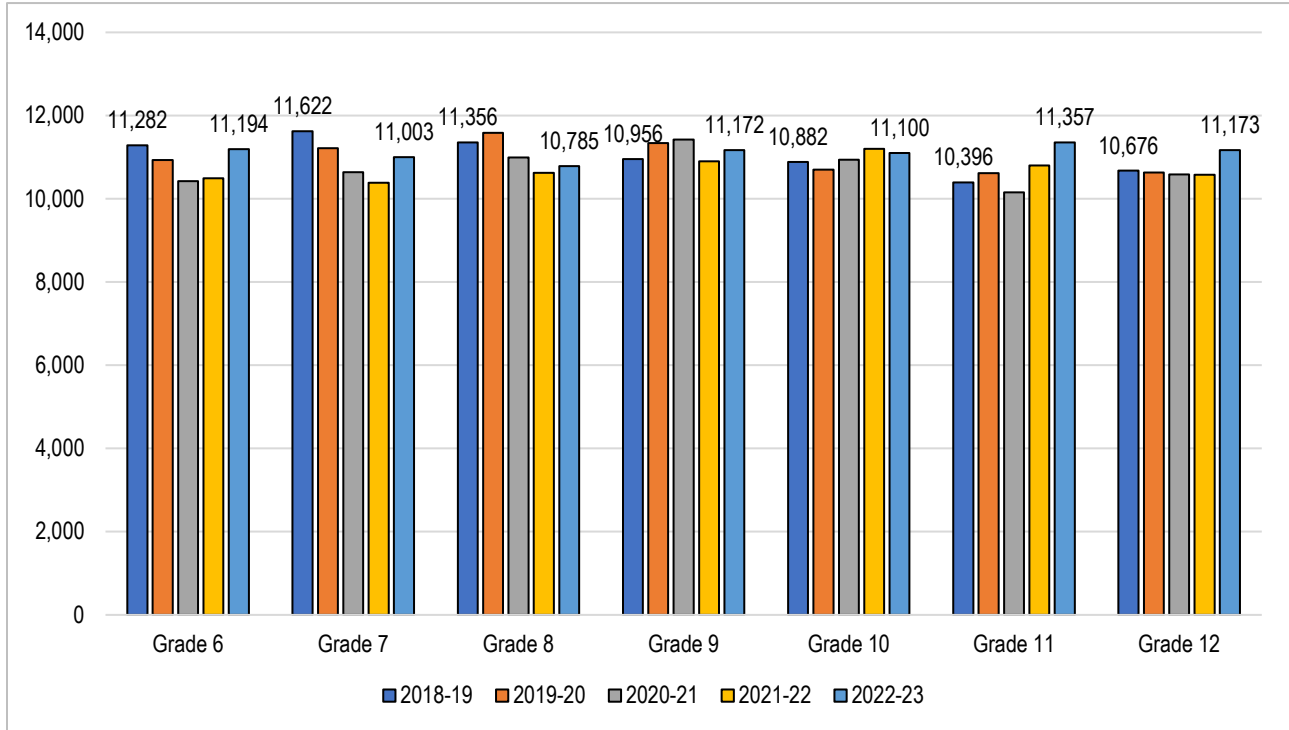
